- Collection of miniature Bibles, with the world's smallest printed Bible

- Denmark-Norway's first Bible, Christian III's Bible from 1550
- The first Bible printed in quarto format with title cover, from 1487
- Themed exhibition on the King James Version, the most printed translation in the world
